

INTRODUCTION

The majority of the family histories below have been researched by Maureen Shaw and typed up by Jann Kirke. They relate to families with Carlton connections who lost husbands/sons in World War 1. The names were taken from the list of soldiers commemorated on a memorial in St. Paul's Church, Carlton. The memorial is no longer in place – the list was provided by Steve Brown.

The information was taken from the Commonwealth War Graves Commission casualty listings and from the Census. Sometimes information seems to be missing or dates don't tally - the information below is as it appears on official records.

Census records of this period do not record exact dates of births, marriages and deaths, only the Quarter of the year in which the details are registered. Place of birth is generally given as the district where the birth was registered rather than the actual address, e.g. Basford (Registration District) Nottingham.

The final two histories were researched by Madelaine Flight, sister of our Webmaster, Graeme Bunting.

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APPLETON, William

Born in Nottingham, Oct/Nov/Dec 1899.

1901 Census: The family lived at 8 Magsin Terrace in the Parish of St. Matthias. **William** was 1 year old and lived with his father, William (26) who was a Cable/Chain Maker, born in Nottingham. His mother was Fanny E (23) who was born in, Stapleford, Derbyshire.

1911 Census: The family lived at Wesley House, Forester Grove, Carlton. Father William (36) was a Chair Frame Maker. Mother Fanny (33) had by then given birth to 3 children, one of whom had died. **William** was 11 and he had a sister, Elsie, who was 2.

Additional Information: Son of William and Fanny Elizabeth Appleton of Nottingham. William Snr. Died on 8 January 1940 at Nottingham General Hospital. He was 64 years old. His address at that time was 17 Forster Grove, Carlton. Administration to Fanny Elizabeth Appleton, widow. Effects: £478.12s.8d. Fanny died in June 1966 in Nottingham. She was 88 years of age.

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BENSON, Henry Graham Benson

Born in Lichfield, Staffs Apr/May/Jun 1896

1901 Census: The family address was Westlake Terrace, Measham, Leics. Walter Benson (36) Coachman-Domestic, born in Derby, his wife Emily (40) born in Staffordshire, and their children Edith (11), Walter E. (10), both born in Middleton, Warwick, Emily J (7), **Henry G** (4) and William (2), all born

in Elford, Staffs.

1911 Census: The family had now moved to 25 Marhill Road, Carlton. Walter Benson (49) Gardener-Domestic, Emily (50) who in 22 years of marriage had given birth to 5 children, all living. **Graham Benson** (14) Packer at a Furniture Works and William (12).

Additional Information: Walter Benson died in Nottingham in June 1925 aged 61 years.

Born in Nottingham, Jan/Feb/Mar 1888.

He married Phoebe Catherine Carter in Basford, Nottingham Jan/Feb/Mar 1909.

1891 Census: Newark Street, Sneinton was the address where the family lived. Jesse live with his father Jesse (30) Railway Shunter born in Bedfordshire, his mother Elizabeth (27) who was born in Rutland, and his younger brother Dennis (1). **Jesse** was 3 and was obviously known by his second Christian name. Both boys were born in Sneinton.

1901 Census: The family lived on Chesterfield Street, Carlton. Jesse (40) was now a Railway Guard and the rest of the family were Elizabeth (37), **Jesse** (13) Errand Boy, Dennis (11), Percy (9), Elizabeth (6) and Ruth (5).

1911 Census: Samuel Jesse Brasier (23) was now living at 134 Curzon Street, Netherfield. With him were his wife Phoebe (22) and their son Jesse Godfrey Brasier (1). **Samuel** was employed as an Engine Cleaner (Railway).

*Additional Information: Son of Jesse and Elizabeth Brasier of 11 Chesterfield St., Carlton, Nottingham, husband of Phoebe Catherine Brown (formerly Brasier), of 18 Salter's Hill, Upper Norwood, London. Phoebe Catherine Brasier married Percy Brown in Lambeth Surrey Jul/Aug/Sep 1917. Jesse Godfrey, the son of **Samuel Jesse** and Phoebe Catherine Brasier, died in Nottingham in July 1999. He was 89 years old.*

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BRIGGS, Claude William

Born in Basford, Nottingham on 6 September 1893.

1901 Census: The family lived on Foxhill Road, Carlton and consisted of William T. (30) Cabinet Maker, wife Ann H (30), **Claude W** (17), Ida (5) and Agnes (2). All were born in Carlton.

1911 Census: Claude William Briggs was listed as being on board HMS Devonshire. He was 17 years of age and was described as a Signal Boy.

Additional Information: Son of William Thomas Briggs of Aston Villa, Church Street, Carlton, Nottingham. Claude's mother Ann died in Basford in June 1916, she was 46 years old.

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BURDETT, Harry

Born in Basford, Nottingham Apr/May/Jun 1894

1901 Census: The family address was Foxhill Road, Carlton. There lived William Burdett (48) Bricklayer, born in Northants. With him was his wife Mary A (47) and their children Mary 924), William (21), Joseph C. (18) Butcher, Ada (15) Bookbinder, Edith (2), John (9) and **Harry** (6).

Before the 1911 Census: both parents had died - May in Apr/May/Jun aged 56 years and William Apr/May/Jun 1910 aged 57 years. Both deaths took place in the Basford District of Nottingham.

1911 Census: Harry's sister Elizabeth married George James Ward in Apr/May/Jun 1903. In 1911 **Harry** (16), Office Boy, and his brother John Edward (19) Tinsmith, lived with them and their family at 45 Cemetery Road, Carlton. George J Ward (34) was a Boilersmith Labourer, his wife Mary E (34) had 3 daughters, Mary (7), Gertie (4) and Ida (1).

*Additional Information: Son of the late William and Mary Anne Burdett, husband of Susan Jane Burdett, of 403 Ashdale Avenue, Toronto, Ontario, Canada. As **Harry Burdett** served with the Canadian Service Corps, it would seem that he met and married his wife Susan Jane in Canada.*

Born in Nottingham Jul/Aug/Sep 1897

1901 Census: The Burton family address was Urban Road, Carlton. George Burton (37) Printer, his wife Emma (38) Lace Clipper and Scolloper, Florence (16) and Lizzie (13) who had the same job as their mother. Ernest (9) and **Claude** (3). Also living with the family were Emma Shelton (7) niece and

William Simmonds (34) brother, Printer. All were born in Carlton apart from Ernest, born in Nottingham. **1911 Census:** The family was now living at 46 Station Road, Carlton. George (47) Printer-Lithographic, Emma (48) who in 29 years of marriage had given birth to 12 children, 6 of whom had died. George (21) Printer-Lithographic, Ernest (19) Compositor Printer, **Claude** (13) working in Printer's office, Bertie (9), Frank William (2). Also living with the family were 2 Boarders: William Simmonds (44) Printer-Lithographic and Ernest Berridge (16) Collier - Pony Driver.

Born in Basford, Nottingham Oct/Nov/Dec 1888.
He married Ada Farrands at Basford, Nottingham Apr/May/Jun 1913.

1891 Census: The Butcher family lived on Windmill Row, Carlton. George Butcher (35) General Labourer, Mary (3?) his wife and their children George (10), Frederick (9), Alice (7), Charley (4), **Frank** (2) and William (8 months), all born in Carlton.

1901 Census: The address was given as Carlton Hill, Windmill Row. The ages of the parents appear to be incorrect. However, these are the details given - George Butcher (52) Tree Feller, place of birth now given as Redwinter, Essex. Mary (46) born in Carlton, as were all the children Fred (19) Nottm Corporation Labourer, Alice (16), Charles (14) Brickyard Labourer, **Frank** (12), William (10), Lizzie (6), Jacky (4), Lily (2) and James (6 months).

1911 Census: Francis Butcher was serving with the Military (4th Batt. King's Royal Rifle Corps.) He was 23 years old and a Rifleman. The census states as follows - ED, institution, or vessel - India.

Additional Information: Both father George and mother Mary had died before the 1911 Census. George in Basford, Nottingham Jul/Aug/Sep 1903 aged 50 years and Mary also in Basford, Nottingham Apr/May/Jun 1906 aged 52 years. In 1911 Francis' siblings were living with their Uncle and Aunt John and Eliza Butcher at Ivy Cottage, Carlton Hill, Carlton. John and Eliza had been married for 18 years and had no children of their own. Francis' widow Ada married John H. Askew of 45 Mount Pleasant, Carlton, Nottingham in Jul/Aug/Sept 1916.

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BUTCHER, Charles

Born in Basford, Nottingham Oct/Nov/Dec 1886

1891 Census - The Butcher family lived on Windmill Row, Carlton, Nottingham.

George Butcher (35) General Labourer, Mary (38) his wife, George (10), Frederick (9), Alice (7), **Charley** (4), Frank (2) and William (2 months). All had been born in Carlton.

1901 Census: The family was still living at Windmill Row, Carlton Hill. George Butcher's age on this census was given as 52 years and his place of birth as Essex, Redwinter. His occupation was Tree-Feller. Mary (46), Fred (19) Nottingham Corporation Labourer, Alice (16), **Charles** (14) Brickyard Labourer, Frank (12), William (10), Lizzie (6), Jacky (4), Lily (2) and James (6 months).

George Butcher died in Basford, Nottingham Jul/Aug/Sept 1903, aged 50 years. (*note census discrepancies in George Butcher's age*). Mary Butcher died in Basford, Nottingham Apr/May/June 1906 aged 52 years.

1911 Census: The majority of the Butcher family were now living with their uncle and aunt at Ivy Cottage, Carlton Hill, Carlton. John Butcher (39) Labourer at Gas Works, born Midwinter, Essex and his wife Eliza, born in Carlton. They had been married for 18 years and had no children. Their nephews and nieces were William Butcher (19) Brickyard Labourer, Ethel Butcher (18) Gasser at Cotton Mills, Lizzie Butcher (16) Errand Girl in Lace Warehouse, John Butcher (14), Lily Butcher (12), Lawrence Butcher (10), and Gerty Butcher (8).

Charles Butcher married Olive Annie Porter in Basford, Nottm Apr/May/June 1908

1911 Census: The address at which Charles and Olive lived was 17 Carlton Hill, Carlton. **Charles Butcher** (24) Brick Carter, his wife Olive (21) had given birth to 1 child, Eva (2). All three had been born in Carlton.

Born in Nottingham about 1879.

1881 Census: The Clarke family lived in Nottingham St. Mary in the Parish of St. Anns. Thomas Clarke (33) Traveller born in Lincolnshire. His wife Harriett (39) born in Norfolk and their children Annie (10), George (9), William (3) and **Charles F** (2). All born in Nottingham.

1891 Census: The address at which the family lived was 36 Robin Hood Close, Nottingham. Thomas (44) Cabinet Maker, Harriet (47), George (19) Cabinet Makers Assistant, Annie E (20), Willie (13), **Charles F** (11). Also living with the family was William H. Clarke (31), brother living on own means, and Cecil Brown (19) Apprentice Cabinet Maker, born in Bingham, Notts.

Charles F married Jemima Forman Oldfield in Nottingham Jan/Feb/Mar 1900.

1901 Census: The address was now 4 Colville Villas, Nottingham, in the Parish of Holy Trinity. **Charles F. Clarke** (22) Furniture Salesman, his wife Jemima F (20) and his mother Harriett (56) widow.

No trace of the family on the 1911 Census.

1891 Census - The Crinage family was living at 92 Querneby Road, Mapperley. Peter C. Crinage (39) Gardener, born Sherwood, Nottingham. His wife Mary (38) born Hoveringham, Notts, and their children Edith M (15), born Sherwood, Nottingham. All the other children were born in Mapperley:, Lillian (12) **Joseph W** (9), Celia A (7), Charles R (4), Agnes (2) and Edgar H (2 months).

1901 Census: The family address was now Mansfield Street, Mapperley. Peter Crinage (40) Gardener (Domestic), Mary (48), Lily (21) Domestic Servant, Annie (17), Edgar (10), Ernest (5) and grandchildren Willie Wells (3) and Lily Wells (2).

1911 Census: The family ws now living at 3 Arthur(?) Street, Netherfield. Peter Crinage (57) Jobbing Gardener, Mary (56) who in 38 years of marriage had given birth to 10 children, all living, and 4 sons were living with their parents. **Walter** (30), Widower, General Labourer, Charles (24) General Labourer, Edgar (20) General Labourer and Ernest (15) Van Boy.

Additional Information: No trace can be found of Joseph Walter Crinage on the 1901 Census. He married Helen Denton in Nottingham Jul/Aug/Sep 1904. She died in Gainsborough, Lincs Jan/Feb/Mar 1908. She was 33 years old.

1901 Census: The family lived on Carnarvon Grove, Carlton. Joseph Cross (40) Bricklayer, born in Ollerton, Notts. His wife Mary (38) born in Bingham, Notts, and their children Joseph B. (12) born in Derby, Annie (11), Charles (7) and **Cecil I**, (1) all born in Carlton.

1911 Census: The family now lived at 10 St. Austin's Drive, Gedling Road, Carlton. Joseph (50) Bricklayer employed by G.N.R. Co. Mary (48) in 24 years of marriage had given birth to 4 children, all living. Annie Maude Mary (21), Charles Harold (17) Pawnbroker's Assistant, **Cecil I**. (11). Also at the same address were Isidore Whomsley described as Father-in-law (Widower) and Albert Rowland (24) who was a visitor.

1901 Census: The Dring family lived at Waimman's Terrace, Dunstan Street, Netherfield. Emily Dring (47) was the head of the household and a widow, born in Sutton, Cambridgeshire. Harry (19) her son was a Brickyard Labourer, born in Carlton and married to Polly (19), born in Alford, Lincs. Her other children were Kate (17) Factory Hand - Cotton, Charles (14) Agricultural Labourer and Frederick (11), both born in Carlton; Horace (7) and **Walter** (4) both born in Netherfield.

1911 Census: The family now resided at 19 Main Street, Carlton. Emily (57), the mother, now gave her name as Emily Clayton and was described as a widow. Her sons Charles Dring (23) Railway Platelayer, Horace Clark Dring (17) Carter in the Grocery Trade and **Walter** (14) Hosiery Knitter.

Additional Information: Emily's first husband Clark Dring died in April 1897 aged 53 years. She married her second husband John William Clayton in Basford, Nottingham, Oct/Nov/Dec 1902. He died before 1911.

1911 Census: The family address was now Orient Villa, Standhill Road, Carlton. Joseph Henry Durose (46) Watchmaker and his wife Elizabeth (41) had then been married for 15 years. Elizabeth had given birth to 3 children, 2 of whom had died, and **Henry** (13).

Additional Information: son of Joseph Henry and Elizabeth Durose, of Nottingham. **Henry Durose's WW1 British Army Service Records** show that he signed up on 22 September aged 19 years. His address at that time was Eastholme, Standhill Road, Thorneywood, Nottingham. His profession was Music Teacher.

Mary Elizabeth Edge (35) Tailoress, born in Manchester, Lancs, married for 9 years had given birth to 2 children, 1 of whom was living: John (7). There were also 6 visitors staying at the address. James Conlan (61) Tailor, born in Dublin, Elizabeth Conlan (55) born in Clapham, London, Gertrude John O'Connor (2), Bernard O'Connor (4 months) all born in Manchester.

Additional Information: son of John and Elizabeth Edge of Longnor, Staffs.

1891 Census - The family was living on Main Street, Carlton, Nottingham. George Straw (37) Baker, born in Lowdham, Notts. Lavinia (35) his wife, born in Burton Joyce, Notts, and their children, all born in Carlton. Fanny (15) Baker's Assistant, Elizabeth (11), George (9), Hannah (6), **Ezra** (2) and Wilfred (5 months). Also living with them were Emma Tivey (19) Baker's Assistant (niece) and George Tivey (14) Baker (nephew).

1901 Census: The family was still living on Main Street, Carlton. George (47) Baker and Shopkeeper, Lavinia (45), Elizabeth (20) Hosiery Embroiderer, George Hy (19) Baker-Journeyman, Hannah (16) Dressmaker's Assistant, **Ezra** (12), Wilfred (10), Gladys (7) and Leslie (2). Emma Tivey (29) niece, Grocer's Assistant, was still living with the family.

1911 Census: The family address was 41 Main Street, Carlton. Lavinia Straw (55) widow, having given birth to 13 children, 5 of whom had died. Wilfred (20) Clerk and Shopkeeper, Gladys (17) Housekeeper and Leslie (12) were living with her.

*Additional Information: No trace can be found of **Ezra** in 1911. However, he married in Jul/Aug/Sep 1910 in Basford, Nottingham.*

George Straw died on 17 February 1907 in Nottingham. He was 52 years old.

Albert Straw (30) married, Builder's Labourer, born in Carlton, Nottingham

William Flemings (39) married, Builder's Labourer, born in Glasgow, Scotland

Frederick Samuel Leaper (28) single, Builder's Labourer, born in Carlton, Nottingham.

*Additional Information: It seems likely that when the 3 men returned to Carlton at the end of their period of employment, **William Flemings** went with them.*

1891 Census: The family lived on Main Street, Carlton and consisted of John Young (36) General Labourer born in Carlton, his wife Anne (26) and their 3 sons - **Enoch** (7), Thomas (2) and John George (4 months), all born in Carlton.

1901 Census: The address was still Main Street, Carlton. John (46) was a Bricklayers Labourer, living with Hannah (36), Ernest (17), **Enoch** (15), Thomas (12), John (10), Fred (6) and Harriet (3). All born in Carlton.

Enoch married Gertrude Carpenter at Basford Oct/Nov/Dec 1908.

1911 Census: Address - Hawthorne Cottages, Carlton, Nottingham. **Enoch** (25) Bricklayers Labourer, Gertrude (28) Point Seamer (Hosiery). The couple had been married 2 years at this time and there were no children.

Additional Information: Son of John and Annie Young of 69 Main Street, Carlton, Nottingham. Gertrude Young died Basford, Nottingham June 1917 aged 31 years.

1911 Census: The family had moved to 12 Inman Road, Attercliffe, Sheffield. **Ernest Young** (39) Fitter's Labourer (engineers), Annie (38), Ernest (13) Errand Boy for Ironmongers, Percy (8) and Harry (6). All had been born in Nottingham.

Additional Information: Annie E. Young died in Sheffield in Apr/May/Jun 1917. She was 44 years of age.

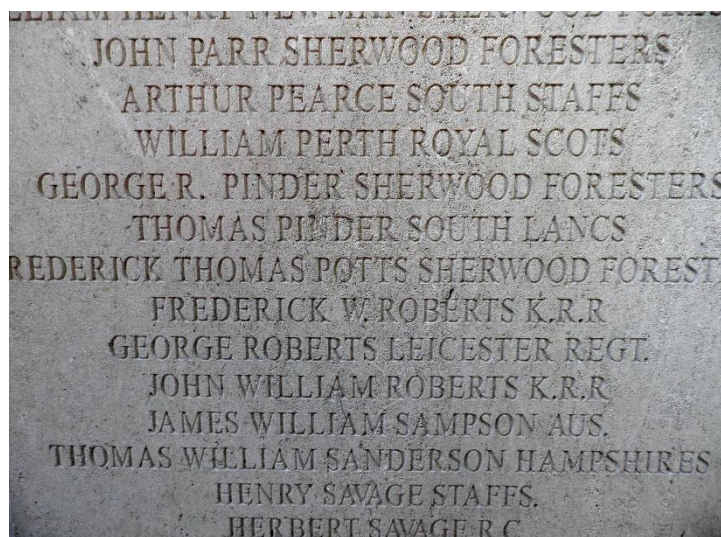
Private George Raymond Pinder:

Graeme Bunting's great uncle and after whom Graeme's Dad (George Raymond Bunting) was named. Born in 1893, he enlisted with the Notts and Derby regiment of the Sherwood Foresters.

He died on 10/10/1915 aged 22 years and is buried in plot E1.6 Potijze Ground Cemetery in Belgium. The regiment had moved to the Potijze sector on 4th October 1915. On 5th 11 men were killed and 19 wounded, 2 killed on 6th, 2 on 7th and 1 on 10th. He could have any one of these people.

The following notice was in the Nottingham Evening Post on 10/10/1924, presumably submitted by his parents:

PINDER – treasured memories of George Raymond Pinder died in action October 10th 1916. Never will his memory fade – loving mother, father, brothers and sisters.

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Albert William Bunting

Graeme Bunting's Grandfather. Born: 17/03/1886 in Nottingham.



He enlisted onto the army reserve 25/11/1915 and mobilised 12/10/1916 just five weeks after Graeme's Dad was born. He was a gunner in the Field Artillery - a gunner is their equivalent of a private. He served twice in France, from January to July 1917 and again March 1918 to February 1919.

As far as is known he wasn't wounded although family memories say he was gassed but there is no mention of that on his military record. Maybe it was an inconvenience rather than a serious problem or perhaps he was milking sympathy from his family with exaggerated claims. He was awarded the British War Medal and the Victory Medal, as were all surviving serving soldiers.
